#### A CHOIR FOR CHRISTMAS

The parishes of Offwell, Widworthy and Farway have formed a choir to sing at


Benefice Carol Services leading up to Christmas. Rehearsals at St. Mary's have been taking place throughout October and November, with the final rehearsal taking



place on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> December. The choir, numbering 30 in all, range in age from 8 to 83; the majority never having sung in a choir before. The choir were helped with breathing and voice exercises by an international music coach who happens to live in Offwell.

Revd. Jeremy has chosen 'The Coventry Carol' for the choir to sing at the Carol Services. It has a haunting melody and the lyrics detail King Herod's harrowing orders, at the news of the birth of Jesus Christ, to slay all children, known as the 'Massacre of the Innocents'. Together with the congregation the choir will give full voice to the more uplifting Carols including 'Hark! The Herald Angels Sing'.

The children at **Farway C of E Primary School** have been busy learning lines and songs for their **Nativity** which takes place at St. Michael & All Angels on **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> December at 5pm.** Everyone is invited to join us and refreshments will be served in school afterwards, with a special visitor making an appearance!

#### **May White**

It was with great sadness that we learnt of the death of May White who died on 5<sup>th</sup> November, at the age of 92. It is perhaps apposite that May should die on Bonfire Night as,

in February 1943, a German bomber destroyed part of her school in Newbury, less than 30 minutes after the end of the school day. If the bombs had hit twenty minutes earlier all the pupils and teaching staff would have been killed. As a teenager May remembers singing in the church choir and helping the Joint War Organisation (JWO) by becoming a Red Cross cadet.

May and her husband Les moved to Offwell from Farway over 45 years ago when, together with Ann Richards and Derek Blackmore, she became a founder member of the Village Hall Committee. May loved Old Time dancing and she ran the Whist Club for many years. In Ann's tribute to May she remembers a lot of happy years, many laughs and many wonderful memories: *"Had it not been for May White Offwell would not have had a village hall. She worked long and tirelessly to see the Hall built and kept it in running order for over 40 years."* 







MARY'S SONG



Do you have a favourite Christmas song?

I have to confess, I used to dislike Christmas music intensely. For about 16 years I worked in large out of town retail stores where Christmas music was played nonstop on the instore *muzac* system from about October onwards. By the time Christmas Day had arrived I really didn't want to hear Mariah Carey ever again. I am better now, by the way.

Music, is of course, one of the reasons people enjoy Christmas so much, along with gifts, trees, mince pies, family, friends and community. Music has a powerful way of connecting with us, moving us, speaking for us, and even challenging us.

So you won't be surprised to hear that we see music and song frequently in the Bible. In fact the first Christmas story starts with a song. Luke's Gospel chapter 1 verses 46-55. Mary's Song, otherwise known as 'The Magnificat'.

It is so easy to think of Mary the mother of Jesus as timid, young and naïve. Illustrated on Christmas cards as just 'another' character in the great story of salvation. But that's not true. Mary's role is front and centre in the Gospel accounts of the Incarnation. She is her own person with agency and vision, a key player in the unfolding story of salvation.

The Magnificat is evidence of her mindset and passion. It is a beautiful and yet powerful vision of the future. A revolutionary canticle of the heart, unfurling a prophetic image of a different world for all to hear.

Through her song Mary recognised the ugliness of inequality and had found hope in God that things would change. She was incensed by the brutality of oppression and yet heard God's plan to transform hearts and minds through love and grace. Mary longed for a better world. She could see that life was not right, and all that she sang out expressed an outpouring of both joy and justice.

Mary could see that she lived in the misshapen and unjust world, and on news of her bearing the Son of God she captured the vision that God had in song. She sang because she knew that the child she was to bear would change the world for ever. When and how it would change, she did not know. But heart by heart, life by life, community by community, the change comes.

Now let me ask you again. What would be your favourite song? I pray that your trust in God and your hope in Jesus Christ will turn your faith into a song like Mary's. And I hope that your love of God and your trust in Jesus' coming will turn your discontent with the world into a song of hope in the name of Christ. May you find hope and peace in the Christ child this Advent and Christmas..

# THE JESSE TREE

Jesse Trees are a very old Christmas tradition dating back to medieval times. They are used to help tell the story of the Bible from creation through to the Christmas story. They are named after Jesse, the father of King David who, according to Chapter One of Matthew, was Jesus' great x 14 grandfather. This is because there is a prophecy in the book of Isaiah (chapter 11: 1-4) which is believed to describe Jesus: *"And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots: And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord."* 

The Jesse Tree is now often used as an Advent Calendar, and this year Offwell school children will be making advent cards for the Jesse Tree in St. Mary's. These will be hung each day throughout December.
