Harvest

Earlier in the year, a lovely person gave me four potted runner' seedlings. After planting them out and watching them spiral their way up my bamboo teepees, I was horrified one morning to see they had been munched on by a visiting deer. I thought I'd lost them. But thankfully not! I have since had a bumper crop of runners to last the winter, and wonderfully tasty too. I was so chuffed by the resurrection of my French legumes that I entered some in the Offwell Flower Show. Sadly, no prize. Apparently, I'd left them on the vine too long.

"Let us gather together in the chancel of our church, and there receive, in the bread of the new corn, that blessed sacrament which was ordained to strengthen and refresh our souls." On October 1st, 1843, "Parson Hawker" gathered his parishioners for the very first Harvest service thanking God for providing such plentiful food.

Harvest Festivals have a lot owing to Revd Hawker, revitalising the Lammas Day custom of the English Middle Ages, which had virtually disappeared by the Reformation. Still, as with all traditions, it is very easy to lose sight of the origins and the meaning behind it all. Harvest celebrations go way back to the ancient religious practice of giving thanks for the 'first fruits of the land', a Jewish ritual called 'Shavuot', celebrated in the Spring. For Christians, this is particularly important since Shavuot is held on a well-known day in the Jewish calendar, the first day of the week immediately following the Passover, which for us Christians is... Easter Day. It turns out that Harvest Festivals are for Christians a second Easter celebration, something that St Paul alludes to in his first letter to the church in Corinth, recalling how the 'festival of the first fruits' points to Christ's resurrection (1 Cor 15:20-23) and the promise of a fuller harvest when all in Christ will be raised.

Despite the many environmental and ecological challenges facing our world, and the trials facing our farming community in Britain today, I pray that our harvest celebrations will also be a hopeful time, that refreshes our faith in the light of Easter and the great harvest to come. I am reminded of a passage in the Book of Job – Job is facing real challenges, even disaster and despair, and God says, "Ask the animals, and they will teach you, or the birds in the sky, and they will tell you; or speak to the earth, and it will teach you, or let the fish in the sea inform you. Which of all these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this? In his hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all humankind." (Job 12:7)

May we praise God for the harvest that we have collected today, and with eager anticipation yearn for the harvest we are yet to receive, and the faith to recognize them both. Amen.

Farway CofE Primary School

We are really pleased to be able to write for our Parish magazine! If you would like any more information about the school, please look at our website or Facebook page. Or if you would like any further information, please contact the school office.



Early Years will be starting the first two weeks with their 'getting to know you' module in Maths, exploring a range of matching and sorting, measure and pattern, shapes and counting activities. They will then explore matching, sorting, and comparing in greater depth through 'Mastering Numbers' and continuous provision. Preschool will be starting with activities to support their listening, which will help later with identifying initial sounds. They will explore these (s,a,t,p) in a variety of contexts, with supporting activities and Bug Club picture books. Reception will be beginning their Phase 2 sounds (s,a,t,p), identifying these within the alphabet and building up to identifying them within simple words.

In Class 1, their topic within Maths will be Place Value. Year 1 will be focussing on numbers within 10 - sorting, counting and comparing, using resources to support them. Year 2 will be focussing on numbers up to 100, beginning to explore place value and using their knowledge of 2's, 55's and 10's to help partition, estimate and compare numbers. As a whole class, they will be participating in activities to support and strengthen skills around 'maths talk', helping to develop mathematical oracy, fluency and reasoning. In Literacy, Class 1 will be starting with '*Dear Mother Goose*', building up to independently write a letter to *Mother Goose*. The children will be looking to strengthen their letter formation by writing a few relevant letters/words each morning and afternoon, which helps build stamina for writing in Literacy.

Class 2 have made a marvelous return to school and have immediately dived into their learning. Their project title is 'Sow, Grow, Farm', which has a geography focus. They will be learning about farming in the U.K. then comparing it to farming in North and South America. At the same time, their science will focus on life cycles and plants, thinking about reproduction and change across the animal kingdom. Last week, they started with the smallest form of sowing and growing – allotments. Immediately they were using their learning behaviours of curiosity and making links, asking questions and showing wonder. They investigated the local environment while thinking about the life cycles of the creatures they found.

In English, Class 2 are reading the beautifully illustrated book by Michael and Clare Morpurgo called 'Where my wellies take me.' This book charts a walk taken in the countryside and links it with many poems that were inspired by the glory of the English countryside. The children will use ideas from this book to inspire them to write their own recounts after a day trip to Branscombe, where they will have the chance to work with other children from across the Federation.

In Maths, Class 2 have impressed with their fluent recall of the structure of mathematics. They have been thinking about place value while counting and making numbers in different ways. Something that would help at home is to practice by reading numbers with 5 or more digits, talking about what the different digits represent and thinking about how the numbers change if you add or subtract 100, 1000, 10,000 or even 100,000. The focus this week is rounding up or down – ask your child to explain how they do that today. We look forward to seeing what awaits us in this new school year!
